What's Changed to the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) ? From October 3, 2024. NDIS is moving towards providing participants and their families with more clarity regarding what will and will not be funded. The aim is to help the scheme get back on track to restore NDIS to its original intent and deliver better outcomes for Australians.

Claiming NDIS for Bus Stop Films

1

Ensure that you are seeking funding from under Group Activities - Social and Community Participation and/or Finding and Keeping a Job

2

Link the Program to your specific goals. You do not need to request for funding for Bus Stop Films Program specifically, it is just about ensuring that the full year fee of \$10,000 is covered within the appropriate line item.

3

Utilise our NDIS Quote letter and if you are a returning participant then utilise our Progress Reports to help facilitate your conversations with Plan Managers.
